April 17, 1924 - April 16, 2019

Asa “Cork” Carlton Eddy of Pfafftown, North Carolina died Tuesday, April 16, 2019 a day shy of his 95th birthday. He was born April 17, 1924 in Huntington, West Virginia to Ross and Olga “Pearl” Eddy. He was preceded in death by his wife, Helen Eddy; two sisters, Ruth Jean and Helen Henley (Lawson); two brothers, Jack (Jenny) and Jim; and two daughters, Jamie Spillers (Scott) and Kimberly Ashburn.
