Margaret P. Martin, 91, of Huntington, passed away, Friday March 25, 2011 at Heartland of Riverview, South Point, OH. She was born July 8, 1919 at the Old Blue Sulphur Hotel at what was then known as Blue Sulphur Springs, West Virginia, later known as Ona, West Virginia. Her father was the caretaker at the hotel at that time. She was the daughter of late Albert G. and Cora M Cyrus Perry. Funeral services will be conducted at 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 30, 2011 at Henson Mortuary Barboursville, with the Rev. Brent Gibson officiating. Burial will follow at Ridgelawn Memorial Park Huntington. She was also preceded in death by her husband of 60 years, John W. Martin and an infant son Stephen A. Martin. Margaret was a member of Mud River Baptist Church, where she was the oldest member in age and years. She held many positions in the church, she was a Sunday School teacher for many years in the children's department. She was a member of the choir. She was active at the state and local level of the West Virginia Baptist.
