He was surrounded by the endless love and care of his family in the peace and comfort of his home in Hurricane, W.Va. Bob was one of the most special people you could ever have known. He was a loving Christian, son, husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, mentor and friend to many. The number of family and friends whom he loved and loved him as well are too numerous to count. He was former chairman of NIFDA (National Institutional Food Distributor Associates), as well as a board member for 16 years.
